The **Chronic Wound Consumables Scheme** is a government-funded program providing **eligible patients** with **subsidised access** to wound consumables.

It supports improved care for Australians with **chronic wounds lasting more than 30 days.**

Step 1: Check Patient Eligibility

- ✓ Australian residents with a chronic wound (>30 days) who are:
 - aged over 65 years
 - a First Nations person aged 50 years or over
- Managed by a Health professional:
 - Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health practitioners
 - · Medical practitioners in a primary care setting, including general practitioners
 - Registered nurses and nurse practitioners
 - Podiatrists
- ✓ Not an inpatient or receiving wound consumables via another funding scheme
- Check details at https://www.health.gov.au/our-work/cwcs to confirm patient eligibility.

Step 2: Complete Training & Register as a Health Professional using the Portal

- Complete and pass all courses and assessments
- ✓ Register for a PRODA account
- Create an individual PRODA account
- ✓ Register for the Chronic Wound Consumables Scheme

Step 3: Assess and Register Patient Order Consumables

- Assess the wound and determine the appropriate dressing type
 - Search for participant with Medicare number, first name and date of birth
 - If not found select -Register
- ✓ Go to Order wound care products and Place an Order
 - Input patient details
 - Search approved products via menus or search.
 - Search via name or category (e.g. ALLEVYN\$\phi\$, IODOSORB\$\phi\$, ACTICOAT\$\phi\$) or Foam dressing
 - Add the products and quantities to your wound cart
- Provide delivery details: you can select patient or practice address

Step 4: Reassess and Continue Care

- Patients can access consumables for up to 12 weeks, with ongoing reassessment
- Best practice: Review wounds regularly and escalate if non-healing
